



Spacetaker is a 501C3 non-profit corporation dedicated to revolutionizing access to the cultural arts by providing, comprehensive, real-time, online access to all of Houston's cultural arts information and through the development of collaborative projects with area businesses, educational institutions, arts organizations, charitable foundations and individual artists that have a positive impact upon the community.



Transistor

Spacetaker, in partnership with Houston Downtown Alliance, Houston Dance Source, and Aileen Mapes Modern Dance Company presents an original dance piece to scour the landscapes of downtown Houston facing Market Square. This project was funded in part by funds from the city of Houston through the Houston Arts Alliance.

"Transistor" was be performed on Saturday, November 18, 2006 at 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. in Market Square. No tickets were necessary, but a chair or blanket were recommended.

Unconventionally, "Transistor" is not performed in a theater; it is performed on the streets and buildings, the action sweeps above and around the audience allowing not a millimeter of movement to be missed. The Houston Downtown Historic District provides a blank canvas for the dancers, with thousands of square feet of untouched cityscape to traverse.

David Brown, Director of Spacetaker, says "The opportunity to present an original performance in this particular manner is absolutely unique. Under no other set of circumstances will the City of Houston have such an ideal opportunity to showcase Houston's modern dance talent while at the same time presenting the community with a larger-than-life piece of original art to be enjoyed by all, for free."

The show experiments with distorting shapes, colors, and texture; as well as examines our identities and transitions through life. Performed by Aileen Mapes (independent choreographer and Suchu dancer), Daniel Adame (choreographer, Suchu dancer and visual artist), and Richie Hubscher (choreographer, Houston Ballet), Transistor is performed to the live accompaniment of two pianos, horns, and African influenced percussion.
